Balloon Angels because of the delight I see in the children who receive the balloons. Being sick is so scary and confusing to a child. The balloons seem to give the children something happy to focus on. Their smiles and joy are my motivation."

This last summer, Julie and her family had an opportunity to relocate back to her hometown of Indianapolis. This was a great opportunity for Julie & her family, but a loss for Balloon Angels – but maybe not.

Julie contacted us about starting Balloon Angels



in the Indianapolis area. Julie explains, "Two of my three children have been hospitalized, twice each. I learned through them how difficult a hospitalization can be for a child. Any gesture of kindness shown to them while in the hospital meant so much to them and to Scott and me. Balloon Angels provides that simple kind gesture that brightens the day of an ill child. I enjoyed volunteering with Balloon Angels so much while in KY that I wanted to help launch it here. I am confident that Balloon Angels will help touch the hearts of the patients at Riley Children's Hospital, too." She has high goals, to bring Balloon Angels to Riley Children's Hospital and also to branch out to other area hospitals, like the Peyton Manning Children's Hospital at St. Vincent. We are looking forward to helping Julie start Balloon Angels in Indianapolis!

Happy Anniversary! November of 2008 marked the 6th anniversary for the Balloon Angels organization! 6 years ago the first volunteers for Balloon Angels went out, bought 10 balloons and took them into the pediatric unit of Baptist East Hospital. Now, 6 years and close to 65,000 balloons later, Balloon Angels is a non-profit charity that delivers free balloons to children at four different children's hospitals in Louisville and Lexington and is now expanding to the Indianapolis area. As you will read in our updates for each hospital that we serve, we are truly in need of additional volunteers. We're currently serving and providing free balloons to hospitalized children at three hospitals in Louisville (Baptist Hospital East, Kosair Children's Hospital, Home of the Innocents), one



hospital in Lexington (UK Children's Hospital) and are starting up at one hospital in Indianapolis (Riley Hospital for Children). OUR #1 NEED right now is additional volunteers to serve at any of the hospitals we serve. If you have volunteered with us in the past, we would

strongly encourage you to give us a call and get back on the schedule – we need you! If you have ever thought that giving out a free balloon to a child in the hospital sounds like something you would like

to be part of – NOW is the time to give us a call! What it takes to be a volunteer?

A Passion for Helping Children. Many of our volunteers are parents and have spent time in the hospital with their own children. They know how tough it can be for a little child to be stuck in a hospital bed, hooked up to various machines and monitors for days at a time. As a parent, they also know the wonderful feeling of watching their child smile and laugh and appreciate anything that can bring this about – including our balloons.



Servant's heart. Our volunteers love to serve and help. They walk down hospital halls with as many as 200 brightly colored balloons at a time – this is quite a sight and quite an experience. Watching the excitement and the smiles as each child gets to pick out that special balloon is just as rewarding to our volunteers as it is for the children and parents.

Compassion. As we enter each of the hospital rooms, there are really two groups of people that are hurting – the child and the parents. By spending time with both, we hope that our gift of a free balloon will help to lift the child's spirits, put a smile on their face, and if only for a little while, help make that stay in the hospital a little brighter place to be for both the patient and the parent.

Time Required. Our volunteers donate one evening each month – that's it! Most volunteers arrive at about 6:15pm and are on their way home by about 8:15pm.
